As students are returning to school and autumn is around the corner, we would like to remind the Valley Stream community that September is Library Card Sign-up Month!

If you don't have a card, stop by and sign up for a library card. If you have let your library account lapse, renew your library card. Or, if you have an active library card, stop by and check out what is available to you at no additional cost to you!

If you enjoy e-books or e-audiobooks *and e-magazines*, your library card gives you free access to the Nassau Digital Doorway collection using Libby.



Or, borrow three of Colleen Hoover's most popular books from the library for free versus buying them from Amazon:

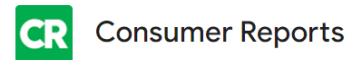

If your child needs homework help, free tutoring help is available from Tutor.com with your library card. There is also free tutoring help for ACT, SAT, AP, and GRE exams.



You can also get free online access to **Consumer Reports** with your library card. (An online subscription is normally \$39.00 per year.) So, before you buy a new car or a new appliance, check out what is the best buy and save money!



If you take advantage of the library's Family Museum Pass program, you can visit certain museums, gardens, and local attractions for free. The admission cost for a family of six to the Long Island Children's Museum is \$108.00, but it is free with the library pass!



Ask at the Adult Reference Desk for the list of passes that are available, and reserve a pass for your next family outing. Plus, there are discount codes available for attractions such as Splish Splash, the Bronx Zoo, the New York Aquarium, and more.

What else is available to you with your library card? You can borrow a T-Mobile hotspot for two weeks for free WiFi internet service – great for travelers or when your internet service goes down! You can borrow launchpads, learning tablets with pre-loaded educational games and books, for your children.



The library has an Orion telescope available for loan for seven days. If you want to try it out, there will be a walk-in telescope demonstration this Thursday, September 12, 2024, from 6-8pm outside the Adult Entrance, weather permitting. And, there will be Telescope Training class on Monday, December 9, 2024.



And, of course, the library offers programs, story times, book discussion groups, craft programs, and other fun activities for children of all ages.

Make it a Blockbuster night!

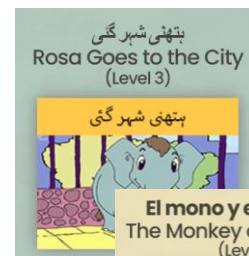

Just remember: Be kind, rewind.

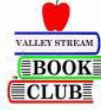

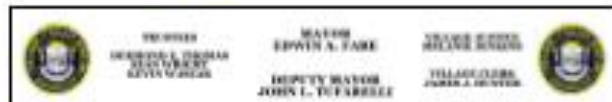

LAUNCHPADS: FUN & EDUCATIONAL

Did you know that the library has Launchpads available for loan? What is a Launchpad?

Launchpads tablets that are pre-loaded with games, books, and other content for children, teens, and adults. There is no need to download programs, and there is no need for WiFi.



There is a protective bumper around the Launchpad tablets, they can safely be used by children. There are learning games such as “A World of Letters” and “World of Adventure,” plus videos from kid favorites such as Clifford the Big Red Dog and Richard Scarry. The contents are vetted by educators.

Parents can borrow up to two launchpads at one time for a 14-day loan period. Launchpads are a great way to entertain and educate your children.

The library also has some learning launchpads for teens and adults – SAT programs, language programs, and brain games.

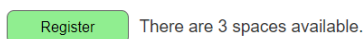


The Henry Waldinger Memorial Library has instituted Eventkeeper registration for most of its programs. This will help the staff keep track of how many people and who are registering for programs.

Digital library cards are still being issued for a 3-month expiration period, even though the library is open for library visits and curbside/lobby service. Please note: We recommend that you come in for a regular library card as soon as possible since digital library cards have a short expiration period. A regular library card is good for three years.



Log in to Tutor.com free online tutoring from subject experts year-round.

Tutor.com is a fully online tutoring service. You can get a tutor 24/7 in **more than 40 subjects** including Math, Science, Social Studies, English, AP® Support, Foreign Languages and Business. This service is available for **FREE** to any Valley Stream library card holder.

Tutoring sessions take place in an easy-to-use online classroom through a web browser. Set up an account today using your library card bar code to start using Tutor.com.

Tutor.com is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 361 days a year — the service is closed on New Year's Day, Independence Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day.



Tutor.com is a Quick Link on the Kids and Teen Pages under “Departments” or you can find it under “Research and Homework Help – Research Databases or Online Services.”

HAVE YOU TRIED A WONDERBOOK YET?

Each Wonderbook is a print book with a ready-to-play audiobook inside. Kids can press the “Play” button to read along with their favorite books on their own.

Some of the Wonderbook titles available include *Corduroy*, by Dan Freeman; *Frog and Toad Together*, by Arthur Lobel; *Big Nate* books, by Lincoln Peirce; Amelia Bedelia books, by Herman Parish; and *The Cricket in Times Square*, by George Selden.

In 2023, the library added more new titles, including chapter books such as *Junie B. Jones and the Yucky Blucky Fruitcake*, by Barbara Park; *Big Nate In a Class By Himself*, by Lincoln Peirce, and *Captain Underpants and the Perilous Plot of Professor Poopypants*, by Dav Pilkey. Just added in December 2022 are books from the *Daniel Tiger* series!

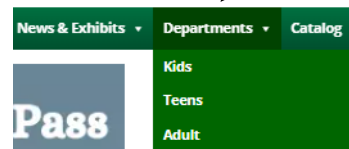

WIFI HOTSPOTS AVAILABLE FOR LOAN



The library is pleased to announce that Valley Stream library patrons can now borrow a T-Mobile Franklin T-9 mobile hotspot for a 14-day loan period! The hotspot may be renewed for another 14-day period if there is no waiting list for it.

During the first few days of November, there was a Verizon service disruption in Valley Stream, and the library loaned out several WiFi hotspots to families who would have had no internet access!

This WiFi hotspot is a device that you can use to connect a mobile-enabled device, such as a laptop smartphone or tablet, to the internet. It is portable, so you can connect your device almost wherever you are – at home, on bus or train, or in the park. **And when you are on vacation!**

Borrowers must sign a Borrowing Agreement form and provide a valid adult Valley Stream library card in good standing. In addition, as with our family museum passes, all family members must be in good standing as the portable hotspot can accommodate up to 15 devices in your home at the same time.

The late fee is \$5.00 per day, and a \$100 replacement fee is billed after 10 days overdue, plus internet service will be turned off if a hotspot is not returned on the due date.

T-Mobile Franklin T-9 mobile hotspots were purchased with a Special Legislative Grant awarded to the Henry Waldinger Memorial Library by New York State Senator Todd Kaminsky (S.D. 9). Without this grant, the library would not have been able to purchase multiple devices to loan to our patrons, so we are very grateful for his generosity to the community.

Some patrons have taken advantage of the WiFi hotspots when they have had disruptions in their Internet service, when they have been on vacation, or when they have travelled to an area where Internet service is spotty. Remember, there is no charge to borrow a hotspot (if you return it on time) for free WiFi access!

Depending on availability, you can reserve to borrow a WiFi hotspot if you are planning a vacation or trip out of town where Internet access may not be available. (Unfortunately, they cannot be used outside the United States.)
