The library also closed today to allow the ceiling installers plus tomorrow (Election Day), to make substantial progress in the work.

Once the work in the Children's Room is finished, the work will move into the Adult Room. The library will be closing on Monday, November 10th plus Tuesday, November 11th (Veterans Day) for more work can be done.

On Saturday, November 1st, work began on the library's construction project to replace the ceilings and to install LED lighting throughout the building. If you have been in the library recently, you may have noticed that some ceiling tiles throughout the building are broken, water stained, or missing.



To accomplish this work, the library had to restrict access to the Children's Room on Saturday, and we will need to close the Children's Room on certain evenings in the coming week.

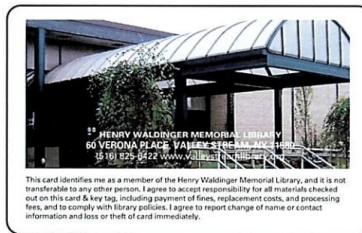
DIGITAL LIBRARY CARDS STILL AVAILABLE

Digital library cards can be used to borrow e-books, e-audiobooks, and e-magazines, plus to access online databases. Digital library cards **cannot** be used to borrow physical books and other materials.

Digital library cards are temporary with a **3-month expiration period**, so we recommend that you come in for a regular library card as soon as possible. A regular library card is good for three years.

COMPUTER CLASSES VIA ZOOM



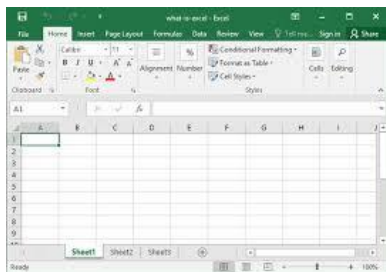

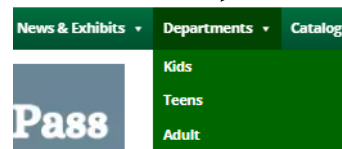
CHECK OUT OUR LIBRARY WEBSITE

LAUNCHPADS: FUN & EDUCATIONAL

Did you know that the library has Launchpads available for loan? What is a Launchpad?

Launchpads tablets that are pre-loaded with games, books, and other content for children, teens, and adults. There is no need to download programs, and there is no need for WiFi.



There is a protective bumper around the Launchpad tablets, they can safely be used by children. There are learning games such as “A World of Letters” and “World of Adventure,” plus videos from kid favorites such as Clifford the Big Red Dog and Richard Scarry. The contents are vetted by educators.

Parents can borrow up to two launchpads at one time for a 14-day loan period. Launchpads are a great way to entertain and educate your children.

The library also has some learning launchpads for teens and adults – SAT programs, language programs, and brain games.

Did you know that you can access Consumer Reports online for FREE using your Valley Stream library card?

Consumer Reports is a Quick Link on the Adult Page under “Departments”, or you can find it under “Research and Homework Help – Research Databases.” Enter your library barcode, you will get access to product reviews for laptops & Chromebooks, air fryers, refrigerators, and over 8,500 different products.

Stop by the library to check out the seed library that has been set up by Local Seed Savers in the Adult Room at the library.

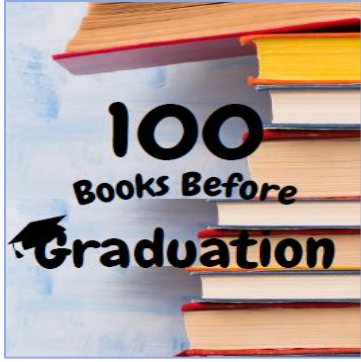

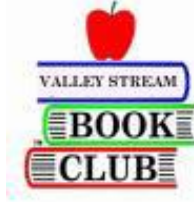

VALLEY STREAM BOOK CLUB RECORDINGS



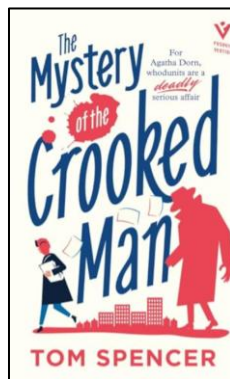

Do you want to learn Spanish? Italian? Japanese?

FREQUENT LIBRARY VISITOR PROGRAM

MIFI X PRO 5G HOTSPOTS AVAILABLE FOR LOAN

The library is pleased to announce that Valley Stream library patrons can now borrow a

The original T-Mobile Franklin T-9 mobile hotspots were purchased with a Special Legislative Grant awarded to the Henry Waldinger Memorial Library by New York State Senator Todd Kaminsky (S.D. 9). Without this grant, the library would not have been able to purchase multiple devices to loan to our patrons, so we are very grateful for his generosity to the community.



MiFi X PRO 5G, an Inseego's 5G mobile hotspot, for a 14-day loan period! The MiFi X PRO 5G replaces the T-Mobile Franklin T-9 mobile hotspot that has served our patrons since 2020, so it was time for an upgrade!

Stream library card in good standing. In addition, as with our family museum passes, all family members must be in good standing as the portable MiFi hotspot can accommodate up to multiple devices in your home at the same time.

Patrons can take advantage of the MiFi hotspots when they have disruptions in their Internet service, when they are on vacation, or when they travel to an area where Internet service is spotty. Remember, there is no charge to borrow a MiFi hotspot (if you return it on time)!

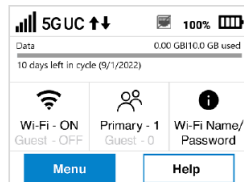
The MiFi hotspot is a device that you can use to connect a mobile-enabled device, such as a laptop smartphone or tablet, to the internet. It is portable, so you can connect your device almost wherever you are – at home, on bus or train, or in the park. **And when you are on vacation!**

The late fee is \$5.00 per day, and a \$100 replacement fee is billed after 10 days overdue, plus internet service will be turned off if a MiFi hotspot is not returned on the due date.

Depending on availability, you can reserve to borrow a MiFi hotspot if you are planning a vacation or trip out of town where Internet access may not be available. (Unfortunately, they cannot be used outside the United States.)

Any device with Wi-Fi capability can connect to the MiFi. You can also connect via USB or Ethernet. The MiFi has two Wi-Fi networks, primary and guest, and lets you connect up to 32 Wi-Fi capable devices.

The MiFi hotspot may be renewed for another 14-day period if there is no waiting list for it.



PLEASE NOTE: The library's MiFi hotspots are very popular around the holidays, so please call to reserve a MiFi hotspot in advance.

The New York Times Online



The Henry Waldinger Memorial Library is now offering access to NYTimes.com, including international, national, and regional news, podcasts, and newsletters (excludes Games and Cooking) – **free onsite library and home access!** Articles are available in English, Mandarin, and Spanish.

Onsite library access requires users to register for an account. Remote home access requires users to enter a Valley Stream library card barcode, to request a 24-hour remote access pass, and to register for an account.

If the bins are full, do not leave the donations outside the bins. **If they get wet, they cannot be used and they end up in the dumpsters!**



Please do not leave donations on the Children's Room Entrance landing. Books left there will be picked up by the Valley Stream Sanitation Department.

From January to September 2023, the library received commissions from Better World Books totaling **over \$600**, so the books placed in the green bins do benefit the library. So, please continue to make your donations to the Better World Books bins!

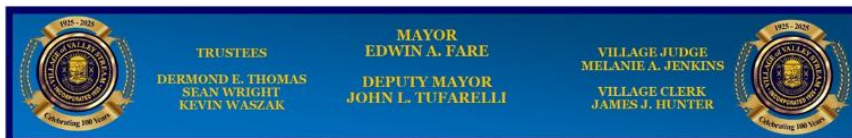

**October 31, 2025 Update:
Impacts of the Government Shutdown on SNAP**

Judges Rule USDA Must Fund November SNAP Benefits

This afternoon, two federal judges **issued rulings** requiring USDA to use its contingency funds to sustain SNAP benefits during the government shutdown. Details are forthcoming, including the exact timing of benefit issuance. Hunger Solutions New York will continue to monitor and provide updates as more information becomes available.

SNAP benefits for November will be delayed. EBT cards will still work, and any benefits on the card can continue to be used.


Families can still submit SNAP applications and must comply with all SNAP requirements, including recertifications, periodic reports, and other change reporting.

Scammers are sending phishing text messages to taxpayers about income tax refunds. The Tax Department does **not** use text messages, email, or social media to request personal tax information.

What this scam looks like

These text messages request **accurate payment information**, supposedly so tax and revenue agencies can deposit money into taxpayers' bank accounts. See an [example of this scam text message](#), so you know what to watch out for.



What to do if you receive a text like this

If you receive a text message that appears to be from the New York State Tax Department:

- **block** the sender,
- **delete** the message, and
- **report** this scam to the Tax Department or IRS.

Mattress & Box Spring Disposal

Bedbugs have become a serious health issue all across Long Island and New York State. Bed bugs are adept at finding their way into luggage, purses, backpacks, and other personal belongings. Bed bugs and mattresses are closely linked, as mattresses and their surrounding areas are prime hiding spots for these pests. Bed bugs are attracted to humans as a food source, and their flat bodies allow them to easily hide in the seams, crevices, and folds of mattresses and box springs. Neighboring municipalities have instituted new policies for the disposal of mattresses and box springs. Our Sanitation Department is following suit.



Proper Disposal Guidelines



- To schedule a pick up, call the Sanitation Department Office at (516) 825-8108.
- You will be given a date and time of when to put out your mattress and, or, box spring.
- The mattress, and, or box spring must now be placed in a mattress disposal storage bag and sealed prior to being placed on the curb for pick up.*
- Heavy duty bags that new mattresses are delivered in can be used as long as they are sealed with tape.
- The Village will not provide mattress bags.
- Mattress disposal storage bags may be purchased at local hardware stores, home improvement centers and various online retailers.
- Failure to follow this procedure will result in your items not being collected.
